Construction work commences at old Town Hall site

The old Town Halll site, located at 26 Bryant Street, will be cordoned off in the coming days for public safety reasons.

Construction crews will be installing barriers, fencing, and other security measures so that demolition and abatement can begin on Monday, October 5. The sidewalk on the south side of Bryant Street, in front of the old Town Hall, will be closed for the duration of the project.

Town Hall departments are now located at 450 Washington Street. Because of the pandemic, the new Town Hall is not yet open to the public. However, staff members are working on site.

UPDATE

MassDOT Project #608587 - Bridge St (Route 109) & Ames St

MassDOT's project began in August. The project limits are along the State Highway's portions of Bridge Street (Dedham Town Line to Ames Street) and Ames Street (Bridge Street to Ames Street Bridge). The project work includes minor roadway widening, sidewalk reconstruction, resurfacing the roadway, re-striping the roadway and reconstruction of the signal at Bridge/Ames Street intersection. The project will include creating ADA-compliant ramps and include designating 5 to 6-foot wide shoulders as bike lanes. The project is anticipated to be completed by the Spring of 2023.

Conservation Department

Massachusetts officials urge residents to keep an eye out for spotted lanternflies .

The Massachusetts Department of Agricultural Resources is warning residents to keep an eye out for spotted lanternflies, an invasive pest that may have been unintentionally imported and planted in several parts of the state.

State officials on Friday announced that two dead specimens of the spotted lanternfly were recovered in the towns of Milford and Norwood.

The pest is said to have been brought into Massachusetts on materials shipped from Pennsylvania counties that are currently under a spotted lanternfly quarantine.

Officials say they also recently learned that nursery stock with spotted lanternfly egg masses and adults may have been distributed across the state.

Anyone who has received goods or materials, such as plants, landscaping materials, or outdoor furniture from a state with a known infestation is urged to carefully check for signs of the spotted lanternfly.

As of Friday, the lanternfly has been detected in Connecticut, Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and West Virginia.

Residents are being asked to take a photo or collect the lan-

ternfly specimen, and report any potential sightings of the pest using MDAR's online reporting form. https://massnrc.org/.../

Residents should look for large, gray insects, about one inch long, with black spots and red underwings, or inchlong, rectangular yellow-

ish-brown egg masses covered with a gray waxy coating.





Rustcraft Road Sewer Improvements Project Update

Construction for the Rustcraft Road Sewer Improvements Project began in on Monday, 6/22. The project started at Station 48+86 (near #105 Rustcraft Road) with the excavation for and installation of the new 10" force main. As of 9/30, the contractor has installed approximately 4,600 LF of the 10" force main. Construction is now off of Rustcraft Road and onto the property of AvalonBay (250 Station Circle) within the Town of Dedham's Sewer Easement. The contractor is tentatively scheduled to do the repaving of Rustcraft Road within the limits of this project in the first half of October. Portions of Rustcraft Road will be shut down and detours set up during this phase of work. Police details are out each day directing traffic around the work site.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month

- In 2020, an estimated 276,480 new cases of invasive breast cancer will be diagnosed in women in the U.S. as well as 48,530 new cases of non-invasive (in situ) breast cancer.
- 64% of breast cancer cases are diagnosed at a localized stage (there is no sign that the cancer has spread outside of the breast), for which the 5-year survival rate is 99%.
- This year, an estimated 42,170 women will die from breast cancer in the U.S. Although rare, men get breast cancer too. In 2020, an estimated 2,620 men will be diagnosed with breast cancer this year in the U.S. and approximately 520 will die.
- I in 8 women in the United States will be diagnosed with breast cancer in her lifetime,
- Breast cancer is the most common cancer in American women, except for skin cancers.
- It is estimated that in 2020, approximately 30% of all new women cancer diagnoses will be breast cancer.
- There are over 3.5 million breast cancer survivors in the United States.
- On average, every 2 minutes a woman is diagnosed with breast cancer in the United States.
