Over 11,000 Dedham voters have taken advantage of early voting.




NOVEMBER 2020

UPDATE

MassDOT Project #608587 - Bridge St (Route 109) & Ames St

MassDOT's project began in August. The project limits are along the State Highway's portions of Bridge Street (Dedham Town Line to Ames Street) and Ames Street (Bridge Street to Ames Street Bridge). The project work includes minor roadway widening, sidewalk reconstruction, resurfacing the roadway, re-striping the roadway and reconstruction of the signal at Bridge/Ames Street intersection. The project will include creating ADA-compliant ramps and include designating 5 to 6-foot wide shoulders as bike lanes. The project is anticipated to be completed by the Spring of 2023.

Spotted Lanternfly Could be in Dedham

The Town of Dedham is asking the community to report any possible sightings of the spotted lanternfly (SLF). According to the massrnc.org, SLF is found on a wide range of plants. While its main host is the invasive tree of heaven, SLF can also be found on the grape, apple, maple birch, willow, plum, pine and more than 100 other plants. SLF is an invasive sap-feeding insect from Asia that was first found in the Unites States in 2014 in Pennsylvania.



The nymphs of this species tend to be less picky about host plants, massrnc.org reports whereas the adults tend to prefer tree of heaven to feed on and lay their eggs.

SLF was first discovered in Berks County, Pennsylvania in September 2014. It is thought to have arrived on a stone shipment around 2012. It has since spread to 26 counties in Pennsylvania and is under a quarantine in that state.


Since then, SLF infestations have also been found in several states; including Connecticut, Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Virginia, and West Virginia. In December 2018, a single dead adult spotted lanternfly was found in Boston.

Description of damage:

- Adults and nymphs of this species cause significant damage by feeding on sap from the stems and leaves of host
 plants as well as the trunks of the trees.
- Adult lanternflies damage plants by feeding on the sap and excreting honeydew. The honeydew then causes sooty mold and attracts other insects that may also cause damage to the plant

Key Features

- Adults have brownish-gray forewings with black spots and appear dull when at rest.
- When disturbed the lanternfly will hop or fly away, revealing bright red and white hindwings.
- Overwinters as a gray egg mass laid on any smooth flat surface. The egg mass resembles mud.
- The first three instar nymphs are black with varying amounts of white speckling. The final, fourth instar nymph is red, black, and white. The nymphs can be found on host plants, often feeding on the softer parts of the plants.

Rustcraft Road Sewer Improvements Project Update

The installation of the 4,885 feet of 10" ductile iron force main has been completed. The contractor is now starting to perform cleanup and restoration work along the limits of the project. The project should be completed by the end of November. Police details will be present to direct traffic around the work area where needed.

Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) Update

The ZBA unanimously approved a request by Petruziello Properties LLC for a Special Permit for a drive-thru use as part of a new proposed Needham Bank branch at 322 & 326 Washington Street and 25 & 27 Harris Street. The proposed bank would be an approximately 1,800 sq. ft. one story building with a drive thru teller/atm and ten offstreet parking spaces. The project will require Minor Site Plan Review with the Planning Board, at a meeting scheduled for November 12, 2020.







Subcontractors working for the parking management company MPS have been busy installing parking meters near the Registry of Deeds

and the county courthouses. Most recently, they have been working down High Street toward Dedham Square. This first phase of the installation will terminate at Washington Street.

Parking meters that have been installed will be going live in November.
The new meters allow payment by coin, credit card, and mobile app.
