



Weekly Project Updates and 7-Day Look-Ahead

Here is a look-ahead at the construction work planned for the Public Safety Building, from April 26, 2021 to April 30, 2021

Project Overview:

Construction of a combined public safety building commenced in December 2020 on the site of the former Town Hall at 26 Bryant Street. The new building will house the staff and equipment of Fire, Police, and Dispatch departments. The new combined Public Safety Building will replace two older Town buildings: Police Station at 600 High Street (built in 1962) and the Fire Station at 436 Washington Street (built in 1930). The new building is scheduled to open in the Fall of 2022.

What to expect April 26, 2021 (Monday) through April 30, 2021 (Friday):

- The project site remains closed to the public.
- During the week of April 19, a crane was brought onsite to begin installing and erecting the foundation footings, piers, walls, and formwork. The crane is also being used to help install the steel rebar along the perimeter footings & walls. Approximately sixty (60) cubic yards of concrete wall placement has been scheduled for Wednesday morning April 28, 2021. (See attached photo for progress and onsite crane, taken April 23, 2021).
- Dewatering system is currently in operation onsite and will remain operational throughout the remainder of the excavation work.
- Trucks may be entering and exiting the site along Bryant Street, hauling material to the site.
- No additional traffic impacts or pedestrian impacts are anticipated during this week.

Crews will be working onsite Monday through Friday, from 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM
