In-Person, Virtual, or Hybrid: Dedham Boards and Committees are Embracing All Options

The Massachusetts State of Emergency officially ended on Tuesday, June 15th at 12:01 a.m., and ending with it were various provisions and relief opportunities put in place by Governor Charlie Baker in response to the Covid-19 pandemic. Among those was the Open Meeting Law (OML) provision to allow for public meetings to occur in a virtual setting; an adaptation that resulted in a measurable increase in civic engagement and participation across Dedham boards and committees. As seen in many other communities in the Commonwealth, by allowing the public to attend via phone or via the internet (using platforms like Zoom and Microsoft Teams), more people were able to attend and interact with local volunteers and elected officials. The positive response and increased attendance motivated officials here in Dedham and across Massachusetts to petition local legislators to extend this OML provision because adaptation to a virtual platform proved to be not only successful in the continua-

tion of municipal government processes, but it showed that productive and efficient business can

occur in a virtual setting and bring more voices to the conversation.

As signed by Governor Baker on June 16, 2021, Chapter 20 of the Acts of 2021 officially extends the pandemic-related OML provision (in addition to others) to allow virtual public meetings until April 1, 2022.

Dedham boards and committees are testing out creative hybrid meeting options (using Facebook live or special meeting camera technology), and many are embracing the return to in-person activities by hosting public meetings in the new spaces available at Town Hall. Additionally, some boards and committees have opted to continue holding meetings over virtual meeting platforms.

Dedham is teaming up with the Metropolitan Area Planning Council (MAPC), the City of Framingham, and the Town of Randolph to develop a hybrid meeting model and best practices guide that will enable any community, board, and committee to leverage technology in a way that enhances community engagement, promotes participation, and builds on the momentum gained over the past year through virtual meetings.

No matter the format or platform, the message remains the same here in Dedham: all are welcome to attend and participate.

This incident demonstrates how situations can turn dangerous fast. Officer Flint is a veteran officer. He is skilled at communicating with people. Thankfully, other officers were present when Officer Flint was suddenly attacked. A less lethal device was effectively deployed to bring the situation under control and the suspect taken into custody without anybody suffering serious bodily injury. The body armor that Officer Flint was wearing absorbed the attack and prevented potential serious bodily injury from being inflicted. We are most thankful that Officer Flint was not injured and that he was quickly back on duty serving the community. On June 17, 2021, our body armor vendor, Armor Express, presented Officer Flint with an Award of Valor plaque.



Elm Street & Rustcraft Road Sidewalk Improvements Project

MassDOT held their Public Information Meeting for this project on April 28th, 2021. The meeting notice was posted a few weeks in advance on the Town's website, social media platforms and The Dedham Times. The public information meeting provided a brief overview of the project including the construction timeline and traffic impacts. 2021 Wet Weather Sewer Inspections


In March, the Town awarded the 2021 Sewer On-Call Services Contract to National Water Main Cleaning Company (NWM). As part of the contract, National Water Main is responsible for this year's wet weather inspections. The wet season in MA typically runs from March through May when the groundwater is at its highest. This allows us to inspect our sewer mains to observe if any of the groundwater (Infiltration) is entering the sewer system. Infiltration does not belong in our sewer system as it reduces the capacity at which our sewer mains can handle wastewater and it also costs all of the Town's sewer customers, through your sewer bill, to have this clean water transported and treated by the Massachusetts Water Resources Authority (MWRA). We will use this information to create a workorder for National Water Main to line these leaking sewer mains to keep the infiltration out our sewer system under this same contract.

2021 Infiltration Sewer Rehabilitation Project

As part of the 2021 Sewer On-Call Services Contract, NVM has started rehabilitating the Town's public sewer mains and manholes that were identified in past wet weather sewer inspections as having infiltration. The project is estimated to remove approximately 62,000 Gallon Per Day (GPD) of infiltration exclusively through trenchless technologies. For our public sewer mains, the project will involve the installation of about 4,600 linear feet of cured-in-place pipe (CIPP) and about 15 linear feet of short liners. For our public sewer manholes, the project will involve the exterior grouting and interior cementitious lining of about 650 vertical feet of manholes. The work for this project is spread out throughout the entire Town and is scheduled to be completed before December 31, 2021.

MassDOT Project #608587 - Bridge St (Route 109) & Ames St

Construction activities are ongoing with MassDOT's contractor for the Bridge Street & Ames Street project. The project limits are along the State Highway's portions of Bridge Street (Dedham Town Line to Ames Street) and Ames Street (Bridge Street to Ames Street Bridge). The project work includes minor roadway widening, sidewalk reconstruction, resurfacing the roadway, re-striping the roadway and reconstruction of the signal at Bridge/Ames Street intersection. The project will include creating ADA-compliant ramps and include designating 5 to 6-foot wide shoulders as bike lanes. The project is anticipated to be completed by the Spring of 2023.
