



Weekly Project Updates and 7-Day Look-Ahead

Here is a look-ahead at the construction work planned for the Public Safety Building, from August 23, 2021 to August 27, 2021

Project Overview:

Construction of a combined public safety building commenced in December 2020 on the site of the former Town Hall at 26 Bryant Street. The new building will house the staff and equipment of Fire, Police, and Dispatch departments. The new combined Public Safety Building will replace two older Town buildings: Police Station at 600 High Street (built in 1962) and the Fire Station at 436 Washington Street (built in 1930). The new building is scheduled to open in the Fall of 2022.

What to expect August 23, 2021 (Monday) through August 27, 2021 (Friday):

- The project site remains closed to the public.
- Weather-permitting, crews will be working onsite on **Saturday**, **August 21**, **2021**, **from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM** for welding steel clips, installing decking, and detail work.
- The dewatering system remains in place and operational.
- Waterproofing and damp proofing of the foundation walls is nearing completion. Crews will address remaining work next week, beginning Monday, August 23, 2021.
- Steel installation will continue using the crane located onsite. To date, approximately **1,064** pieces of steel have been installed.
- Deliveries of steel and metal decking will continue next week.
 - Expect periodic entrance and exit of large trucks at the project site entrance, located at the intersection of Washington Street and Bryant Street. Please expect minor traffic delays at this intersection.
- To maintain an efficient and organized job site, crews will continue to remove excess material for the site.
- No additional traffic impacts or pedestrian impacts are anticipated during this week.

Public Viewing Area:

If you want to stop by to check out the progress, stand by the picnic table outside the north entrance to Town Hall. This spot provides a great view into the project site and is outside of the project boundaries. Worth a visit!

Construction Hours:

- Weather-permitting, crews will be working onsite on **Saturday, August 21 from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM.** Trucks may be entering and exiting the site to remove material.
- Crews will be onsite next week, Monday through Friday, from 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM


