



Weekly Project Updates and 7-Day Look-Ahead

Here is a look-ahead at the construction work planned for the Public Safety Building, from January 10, 2022 to January 14, 2022

Project Overview:

Construction of a combined public safety building commenced in December 2020 on the site of the former Town Hall at 26 Bryant Street. The new building will house the staff and equipment of Fire, Police, and Dispatch departments. The new combined Public Safety Building will replace two older Town buildings: Police Station at 600 High Street (built in 1962) and the Fire Station at 436 Washington Street (built in 1930). The new building is scheduled to open in the Fall of 2022.

What to expect January 10, 2022 (Monday) through January 14, 2022 (Friday):

- The project site remains closed to the public.
- Dewatering system is still operational and the site contractors are backfilling the underground telecommunications and data duct banks along the west and south sides of the site.
- Crews will be working onsite **Saturday**, **January 8**, **2022** and **Sunday**, **January 9**, **2022**, to remove snow and to continue to spray fireproofing in the garage. Snow will be removed from the site, so trucks will be entering and exiting from the corner of Washington Street and Bryant Street. Please use caution in this area.
- As of **Friday, January 7, 2022,** Eversource has installed four out of five new utility poles along Bryant Street at the western side of the site.
- On **Monday, January 10, 2022,** crews will continue to run the rough electrical through the concrete masonry unit (CMU) walls in the garage. Within the garage, crews will all continue to install 4" CMU walls,
- Roofers will begin installing the roof framing and parapet walls at the edges of the roof.
- Crews will continue to install spray fireproofing materials in the basement to protect structural elements from extreme temperatures and heat generated by fire.
- The installation of interior and exterior cold form metal framing and Densglass sheathing will continue this week.
- Expect periodic entrance and exit of large trucks at the project site entrance, located at the intersection of Washington Street and Bryant Street. **Please expect minor traffic delays at this intersection.**
- No additional traffic impacts or pedestrian impacts are anticipated during this week.

Public Viewing Area:

If you want to stop by to check out the progress, stand by the picnic table outside the north entrance to Town Hall. This spot provides a great view into the project site and is outside of the project boundaries. Worth a visit!


