



Weekly Project Updates and 7-Day Look-Ahead

Here is a look-ahead at the construction work planned for the Public Safety Building, from January 17, 2022 to January 21, 2022

Project Overview:

Construction of a combined public safety building commenced in December 2020 on the site of the former Town Hall at 26 Bryant Street. The new building will house the staff and equipment of Fire, Police, and Dispatch departments. The new combined Public Safety Building will replace two older Town buildings: Police Station at 600 High Street (built in 1962) and the Fire Station at 436 Washington Street (built in 1930). The new building is scheduled to open in the Fall of 2022.

What to expect January 17, 2022 (Friday) through January 21, 2022 (Friday):

- The project site remains closed to the public.
- Crews will be working onsite on **Monday**, **January 17**, **2022** during normal construction hours (listed below).
- The stormwater infiltration system excavation was completed, and installation is underway. The system was inspected by Nitsch Engineering on **January 6, 2022,** as requested.
- As of **Friday**, **January 14**, **2022** crews have completed the spray fireproofing in the basement. The work has been inspected and crews received the required signatures.
- Eversource is scheduled to return this week to install the fifth and final utility pole along Bryant Street.
- Roofers will continue to install the roof framing and parapet walls at the edges of the roof.
- The exterior cold-formed metal framing and Densglass sheathing installation is **substantially complete**. Crews will continue the installation of interior cold formed metal framing this week.
- Expect periodic entrance and exit of large trucks at the project site entrance, located at the intersection of Washington Street and Bryant Street. **Please expect minor traffic delays at this intersection.**
- No additional traffic impacts or pedestrian impacts are anticipated during this week.

Public Viewing Area:

If you want to stop by to check out the progress, stand by the picnic table outside the north entrance to Town Hall. This spot provides a great view into the project site and is outside of the project boundaries. Worth a visit!
