

### BOARD OF HEALTH UPDATE – JANUARY 14, 2022



### SELECT BOARD TO HOST SECOND OF TWO VIRTUAL LISTENING SESSIONS FOR TOWN GREEN PROJECT

The Select Board is encouraging those who were not able to attend the first listening session on Tuesday, January 11 to join them next Tuesday, January 18 at 6:30 p.m. on Zoom to share comments and suggestions regarding the proposed Town Green project on the Police Station property. A recording of the first listening session is available on Dedham TV local channels and on <u>www.dedhamtv.com</u>.

Over seventy participants joined the first Select Board listening session on Tuesday, January 11, 2022 via Zoom and expressed their feedback regarding the <u>proposal prepared by</u> <u>the Dedham Square Planning Committee (DSPC)</u>. The Select Board is using all feedback that residents and taxpayers have shared with them during the listening sessions and through written communications to inform them as they review the proposal and take an official vote to recommend the project to Town Meeting or to seek additional information.

The primary goals of these listening sessions are for the Select Board to hear directly from the public about the proposal and to hear what they envision to be the best option for the Police Station property, located at 600 High Street in Dedham Square. Each listening session includes a public comment period where attendees who wish to speak will be given 3 minutes and all comments and questions will be documented as part of the public record. The listening session will not include a question and answer session with the Select Board.

The Select Board is planning to continue their discussion and take a vote at an upcoming public meeting. All meeting agendas are posted with the Town Clerk and made available on the Town website where they are also be shared via email to subscribers. The process to review the potential use and reuse of the current Police Station Property at 600 High Street began in 2019 when the Select Board asked the DSPC to evaluate and research the economic development opportunities for this space. The DSPC is a group of more than twenty volunteers, representative of each Dedham precinct, who have contributed their time and a variety of skills and experience to this process. The DSPC **presentation of the final proposal to the Select Board in November 2021** marked the culmination of more than two years of diligent work and research that included the professional expertise of design and real estate consultants, and a series of community engagement events with residents from each precinct and neighborhood who expressed a variety of opinions and suggestions for the property that were incorporated into the final proposal to the Select Board.

As the Chief Executive Office of the Town, the Select Board must now complete the next step in the overall process by taking a vote to recommend the project to Town Meeting for funding or vote to seek additional information based on their findings and review of the proposal.

## Biden-Harris Administration Requires Insurance Companies and Group Health Plans to Cover the Cost of At-Home COVID-19 Tests

The Biden-Harris administration <u>announced</u> as of Saturday, January 15, 2022, insurance companies and group health plans will cover the cost of at-home COVID-19 tests. This coverage will enable people with private health insurance to get at-home tests paid for by their insurance provider, or they can be reimbursed for the cost by submitting a claim to their insurance provider. Insurance companies and health plans are required to cover 8 free over-the-counter at-home tests per covered individual per month. The tests must be authorized, cleared, or approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA). A list of FDA-approved test kits can be found in <u>this update</u> on the Town's website. #### Baker-Polito Administration Launches Tool for Residents to Access COVID-19 Digital Vaccine Card

Residents can now access a virtual copy of their COVID-19 vaccine card through the State's My Vax Records program. The program allows people who received their vaccination in Massachusetts to access their own vaccination history and generate a COVID-19 digital vaccine card. The electronic record shows the same information as a paper CDC vaccine card: name, date of birth, date of vaccinations, and vaccine manufacturer.

The program is easy to use - a person enters their name, date of birth, and mobile phone number or email associated with their vaccine record. After creating a 4-digit PIN, the user receives a link to their vaccine record that will open upon re-entry of the PIN.

If you are unable to locate your record, or to report discrepancies in immunization records, **use this link to submit a request for further assistance**.

### **COVID-19 Vaccine**

Residents 5 years and older are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine and residents 12 years and older are eligible to get a COVID-19 booster. The Board encourages anyone who is eligible to get vaccinated. Vaccine appointments can be scheduled at **vaxfinder.mass.gov**.

### **ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION INSTALLATION AT TOWN HALL**

Construction began this week to install a new, electric vehicle charging station in the front parking lot at Town Hall. The charging station will be located at the southwest end of the front parking lot, adjacent to the south entrance off Washington Street. Below is a rendering of the location of the new charging station <u>as presented</u> to the Planning Board on January 12, 2022:

### ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION INSTALLATION AT TOWN HALL (CONTINUED)

Weather-permitting, the south driveway entrance to Town Hall will be closed on Wednesday January 19, 2022 to allow for the trench excavation across the driveway, installation of new conduit, backfill, and installation of asphalt along the cut driveway. Police officers will be onsite during this time to help direct traffic into and out of the Town Hall parking lot through the north driveway entrance (closest to the Fire Station).

What to Expect:

- **Tuesday, January 18, 2022**: The preparatory work will include preliminary excavation work along the existing fence line, at the planting bed in front of the parking spaces, and saw-cutting the asphalt in advance of the actual demolition and excavation of the driveway.
- Wednesday, January 19, 2022: The construction and installation work will include digging up and excavating across the south driveway entrance into Town Hall. The south driveway entrance to Town Hall will be reopened as soon as possible, with the use of temporary steel plates, if necessary.

\*Please exercise caution when driving into or exiting the South Drive as the driveway will be reduced to  $\frac{1}{2}$  of its width to allow for continued access into Town Hall and the Senior Center during this time.

Electrical Work will then follow to run power and control wiring and complete the installation of the power distribution box and the charging station itself. Additional software & programing work will complete the installation.


Anticipated Project Timeline:

- Excavation work is expected to last one week, weather-permitting, from January 17 through January 21, 2022.
- Wiring and installation of distribution box and charging device should follow the second week (week of January 24, 2022).
- Final hookups, installation of new Eversource meter, software downloads, and programming will follow on the third week (week of January 31, 2022).

Please note: Per the approved agreement with the Planning Board, the parking spaces adjacent to the new charging station are not intended to be reserved for electric vehicles only. Any employee or visitor with business at Town Hall can park in those spaces.

We will provide construction updates as the project continues. Thank you in advance for your patience as we continue to improve Town Hall.

### COUNCIL ON AGING TO HOST EVENT WITH LOCAL HISTORIAN



A Presentation on My Dear Mother: Civil War Letter to Dedham from the Lathrop Brothers Thursday, January 20th at 5:30 p.m. RSVP by calling **781-751-9495** 

During the American Civil War, scores of Dedham men proudly answered the call to serve. In fact, there were several companies composed almost exclusively of Dedham men. In the four years during which these men served, they sent numerous letter back to Dedham describing their lives in camp and in battle.Fortunately, hundreds of these letters were provided to the Dedham Historical Society and Museum for preservation.

## COUNCIL ON AGING TO HOST EVENT WITH LOCAL HISTORIAN (CONTINUED)

Stuart Christie, a 40 year Dedham resident and avid amateur historian, spent three years in the DHSM archives transcribing the letters of three Dedham brothers, each of whom served in separate units during the war. During a five month period, the oldest brother John fought in the Battles at South Mountain, Antietam, and Fredericksburg. His younger brother, Julius, initially fought under General Burnside in North Carolina before being transferred to Louisiana where he fought and died under General Banks. Youngest brother Joe, who initially served in the infantry, was discharged and then returned to serve in the cavalry.

The letters have been compiled into a book entitled, <u>My Dear Mother: Civil</u> <u>War Letters to Dedham from the</u> <u>Lathrop Brothers</u>. Stuart is going to talk about this amazing family, who were the descendants of the first Puritan minister in Situate and who continued to live in Dedham into the mid-20th century. He will also discuss the letters themselves, read some of the highlights of these letters and share some of the findings he made while going through these letters.

In almost two years of presenting his work on this book, this will be the first presentation made in person. Some of the brothers' artifacts will also be on display during the presentation.

### PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING UPDATES

### What to expect January 17, 2022 (Monday) through January 21, 2022 (Friday):

- The project site remains closed to the public.
- The stormwater infiltration system excavation was completed, and installation is underway. The system was inspected by Nitsch Engineering on **January 6**, **2022**, as requested.
- As of **Friday**, **January 14**, **2022** crews have completed the spray fireproofing in the basement. The work has been inspected and crews received the required signatures.
- Eversource is scheduled to return this week to install the fifth and final utility pole along Bryant Street.
- Roofers will continue to install the roof framing and parapet walls at the edges of the roof.

### What to expect January 17, 2022 (Monday) through January 21, 2022 (Friday):

- The exterior cold-formed metal framing and Densglass sheathing installation is **substantially complete**. Crews will continue the installation of interior cold formed metal framing this week.
- Expect periodic entrance and exit of large trucks at the project site entrance, located at the intersection of Washington Street and Bryant Street. **Please expect minor traffic delays at this intersection**.
- No additional traffic impacts or pedestrian impacts are anticipated during this week.


