Engineering Department Updates

The Engineering Department will be utilizing this Twitter account to post information related to our stormwater system and what we all can do as a Town to improve the water quality of waterways and natural resources.

2022 Wet Weather Inspections

The wet weather inspections for 2022 are set to begin this month. This work will be handled by the Town's contractor, National Water Main Cleaning Company, under our existing 2021 Sewer On-Call Services Contract. The wet season in MA typically runs from March through May when the groundwater is at its highest. This allows us to inspect our sewer mains to observe if any of the groundwater (Infiltration) is entering the sewer system. Infiltration does not belong in our sewer system as it reduces the capacity at which our sewer mains can handle wastewater and it also costs all of the Town's sewer customers, through your sewer bill, to have this clean water transported and treated by the Massachusetts Water Résources Authority (MWRA). We will use this information to create a work order for National Water Main to line these leaking sewer mains to keep the infiltration out our sewer system under this same contract.

Department Bid Openings

The Engineering Department and Department of Public Works held 3 bid openings in March. The bid, the contractor awarded the contract, and the bid price are as follows:

- CY2022 Asphalt Paving & Resurfacing – Awarded to Rochester Bituminous Products, Inc from West Wareham, MA with a bid price of \$1,860,611.00
- CY2022 Crack Sealing Awarded to Superior Sealcoat, Inc. from Wilmington, MA with a bid price of \$61,410.00
- **Bio-Retention Basin** Maintenance – Awarded to San Marino Landscape and Contracting Corp. from Dedham, MA with a bid price of \$13,900.00.

Bid tabs for all 3 contracts can be found on the <u>Engineering</u> Department website.

The Engineering Team will continue to work with each of the awarded contractors over the next month to execute and finalize contracts with Notice To Proceeds to follow.

Elm Street & Rustcraft Rd Sidewalk Improvements **Project:**

The project is anticipated to begin again mid-March to early-April. Due to the additional work to be completed by Eversource Gas & Electric, MassDOT has granted an extension to the end date of the contract. The original completion date at the end of 2022 is now by June 2023. The State's contractor will start the beginning of the construction season with the continued installation of the miscellaneous drainage utility followed by the installation of granite curbing and sidewalks. Dedham Police Launch Community Survey

The Dedham Police Department is conducting a community survey related to police services. This survey is being conducted in order to gain community insight related to customer service, crime-related perceptions, community concerns, and police services. Responses to this survey will be anonymous.

Previous surveys from the Police Department were conducted in 2013, 2016, and 2019. Results from these surveys provided valuable information to the Dedham Police Department and created a baseline for future surveys.

All residents, business owners, and visitors to Dedham are invited to complete this survey. It is important for the Police Department to obtain input from the community which we serve.

The survey should take approximately 15-20 minutes to complete.

By completing this survey, you will provide the Police Department with information that can be used to guide future programs and activities of the Police Department. Further, information related to individual neighborhood concerns can be identified so that the proper resources may be dedicated to the proper areas of Town. The results of this survey can be used as a catalyst for continued improvement.

MassDOT Flashing Yellow Arrow Signal

According to the Traffic Safety Division of the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT), more than 350 traditional left-turn signals have been retrofitted to the new, flashing yellow arrow since 2013. These new signals are primarily seen over a left turn lane and signal the driver to YIELD to oncoming traffic and pedestrians prior to crossing through the intersection. Most importantly, they are signaled to do so with caution.

The increased prevalence of these flashing yellow arrows has created confusion for some drivers, so the team at MassDOT has shared the follow graphics and short videos to help drivers understand how to respond when approaching this light at an intersection:

Graphic above: The traditional 5head and 3-head signal with the left turn arrow vs. the new, flashing yellow arrow

Videos above (click to play): The flashing yellow arrow signal aims to replace the circular green indication for left turns at signalized intersections. When the arrow is flashing, drivers are allowed to turn only after YIELDING to all oncoming traffic and to any pedestrians in the crosswalk

Officer Frasca Receives Commendation



Last month, Dedham Police Officer Joseph Frasca was presented with a commendation for Excellence in Crisis Intervention Training (CIT).

The Brookline Police Department is a training center for Crisis Intervention Training and host a number of 40-hour CIT trainings that our officers attend.

Over the past couple of years, the Brookline PD in their capacity as a training center has been reaching out to recognize officers for their efforts in their communities. The Dedham Police Department submitted the following nomination for Officer Frasca:

Officer Frasca with Sgt. Chris Malinn of the Brookline Police Department. Sgt. Malinn presented the award.

Officer Frasca is CIT trained. He has been a police officer with the Dedham Police Department for 3 ½ years. He is a Veteran of the United States Navy.

Officer Frasca's response to calls for service involving vulnerable community members or those suffering from mental health issues consistently reflect an approach where he addresses the persons current state, allows the person to communicate what they are experiencing at the moment, offers reassuring and supportive feedback, and when appropriate, a suggestion that the person seek assistance to get through the current situation, and ultimately to a better place mentally.

When necessary, he will negotiate with a person in crisis to get them to voluntarily seek help. Officer Frasca will often offer to facilitate communication on behalf of the person he is interacting with to let a family member or friend know of the situation. Officer Frasca has been effective in his approach to interacting with persons in crisis. Officer Frasca has further shown where he will put in the effort to facilitate resolutions to problems impacting vulnerable populations.

Congratulations, Officer Frasca! Thank you for your diligent efforts to keep the Dedham community safe!

Rabies Clinic Coming to Dedham

The Town of Dedham and the Animal Rescue League of Boston are teaming up to host a rabies vaccination clinic for dogs, cats, and ferrets. The clinic will be held on **Saturday**, **May 21, 2022, from 9:00am – 1:00pm**, at the Animal Rescue League of Boston, 55 Anna's Place, Dedham.

The clinic is open to both Dedham residents and non-residents. The fees are listed below:

- Free for Dedham residents
- \$10 for non-residents
- Microchips will also be available for \$10

Please remember:

- All dogs must be on leashes and under owner/keeper control.
- Aggressive dogs must be muzzled prior to arrival.
- All cats/ferrets must be secured inside pet carriers.

For Dedham residents, the Town of Dedham will be providing on-site dog licensing for the 2022 year. The cost for licensing is: \$10 for spayed/neutered dogs; \$15 for nonspayed/non-neutered dogs. (*A Rabies certificate is required for dog licensing.)
