

Assessors Office Dates and Deadlines

Did you know? The Town of Dedham operates on a fiscal year: July 1st to June 30th. Therefore, June 30th is the last day of Fiscal Year 2022 and July 1st begins Fiscal Year 2023. The Dedham Assessors Office uses a quarterly tax billing system, so tax bills are mailed out four times per year. The mailing schedule is listed below:

• First Quarter: July 1 (Preliminary Tax Bill)

Second Quarter: October 1 (Preliminary Tax Bill)

Third Quarter: January 1 (Actual Tax Bill)
Fourth Quarter: April 1 (Actual Tax Bill)

First Quarter Tax Bill Be on the lookout for your First Quarter tax bill for Fiscal Year 2023. Tax bills are sent 30 days before their due date. Due dates for each guarterly tax bill are listed below.

First Quarter Tax Bills due: August 1

- Second-Quarter Tax Bills due: November 1
- Third Quarter Tax Bills due: February 1

Fourth Quarter Tax Bills due: May 1

Note: If the first of the month falls on a weekend, your bill is due on the following Monday.

What does "Preliminary Tax" mean? The preliminary tax is based on the prior year's adjusted net tax on the property plus the 2.5 percent tax increase allowed under Proposition 2 ½ (and any tax increase attributable to approved overrides or exclusions, if any). The preliminary tax is payable in two equal installments; due on August 1st and November 1st as mentioned above.

Process After the Town of Dedham sets its tax rate, the Assessors Office makes the actual tax commitment and the Collector mails actual tax bills for the year. The Third Quarter Actual Tax Bill will have the new valuation set by the Assessors and approved by the Department of Revenue, as well as the new set tax rate approved by our local Select Board.

How is the actual tax calculated? Your actual tax is calculated by taking the new assessment valuation per thousand multiplied by the new tax rate. The actual tax due is the balance after the first and second preliminary tax installments are credited against the total tax due. The actual tax is payable in two equal installments; due on February 1st and May 1st as listed in the schedule above.

Example Calculation: FY22 Avg. SFR* = $$597,742 / $1,000 \times $13.35** = $7,979.86$

*Avg. SFR stands for Average single-family residence **\$13.35 is the FY22 residential tax rate in Dedham

Elm Street & Rustcraft Rd **Sidewalk Improvements** Proiect

The project is anticipated to begin again mid-March to early-April. Due tổ the additional work tổ bể completed by Eversource Gas & Electric, MassDOT has granted an extension to the end date of the contract. The original completion date at the end of 2022 is now by June 2023. The State's contractor will start the beginning of the construction season with the continued installation of the miscellaneous drainage utility followed by the installation of granite curbing and sidewalks. Grants Awarded to Dedham

- MassDOT Local Bottleneck Reduction Program (Estimated Grant Value of \$100,000) - Town of Dedham was selected for the Fiscal Year 2022 funding round. The Town of Dedham's application included the following signalized intersections in the downtown area: High Street and Ames Street/Court Street, High Street and Washington Street/Eastern Avenue and High Street and East Street/Harris Street and High Street at East
- Street/Harvard Street.
 MassDOT's 2022 Shared Streets
 & Spaces Grant (\$25,000) The Town received \$25,000 under it's "Equipment Only" application submitted under this grant. This grant will be used to purchase the Rectangular Rapid-Flashing Beacons (RRFB's) to be installed as part of the Greenlodge Street Corridor Improvements Project. These RRFB's will be installed at the main Greenlodge Elementary School crosswalk at the intersection of Greenlodge Street and Colwell Drive. The Town anticipates receive the Notice To Proceed from the State before November 1, 2022.


MassDOT Project #608587 -Bridge St (Route 109) & **Ames St**

Construction activities are ongoing with MassDOT's contractor for the Bridge Street & Ames Street project. The project limits are along the State Highway's portions of Bridge Street (Dedham Town Line to Ames Street) and Ames Street (Bridge Street to Ames Street Bridge). The project work includes minor roadway widening, sidewalk reconstruction, resurfacing the roadway, re-striping the roadway and reconstruction of the signal at Bridge/Ames Street intersection. The project will include creating ADA-compliant ramps and include designating 5 to 6-foot wide shoulders as bike lanes. The project is anticipated to be completed by the Spring of 2023.

Health Dept. Staff Highlight



Dedham Public Health Nurse Jessica Tracy presenting her White Paper

Dedham Public of Health Town Tracy recently lessica from Worcester graduated University with her Masters Science in Public **Health Nursing** Specialty.

To complete her degree, Jessica wrote the Massachusetts Association of Public Health Nurses (MAPHN) White Paper about the future of public health nursing.

As a continuous advocate for public health nursing and for providing better access to community resources, Jessica's paper focuses on the ways to improve the current state of public health nursing across the State of Massachusetts.

Referencing the State Action for Public Health Excellence (SAPHE) Act signed by Massachusetts Governor Charlie Baker in April 2020, Jessica's paper highlights the increasing challenges to provide care at a local level as a result of the lack of funding, staffing shortages, inconsistent data collection, and continued training opportunities.

In June 2021, Jessica joined more than 130 other public health professionals and legislators to advocate for the use of federal funds to invest in local public health programs that can help communities overcome these challenges.

Riverdale Playground ADA Improvements

Phase 1 of the Riverdale Elementary School Playground Improvements Project was completed in April 2022 and included replacement of the front half of the playground and ADA upgrade of playground equipment. As part of the upgrade, new ADA accessible play equipment was installed to ensure every child could enjoy this community park. In addition, Phase 1 of this project included the expansion of the rubber surface (made of poured-in-place rubber) to cover all "fall zones" within the playground, instead of just the pathway. ("Fall zones" within in a playground are defined as the areas around slides, swings, and climbing equipment where specific surface materials must be used to prevent injuries.)

The Town of Dedham originally provided \$100,000 in capital funds, and with additional grant funding and tremendous community support from the Riverdale PTO, the Dedham Commission on Disability, private donations, and continuous fundraising efforts, the entire project is slated for completion **by early August 2022.** Phase 2 will begin in July 2022 with a community build and will include the replacement of the back half of the playground, new accessible play equipment, and the installation of more rubber surface in the "fall zones".
