JULY 2022 TO DECEMBER 2022 TRASH & RECYCLING GUIDE AVAILABLE AND NEW HAULER, AS OF JULY 1

Beginning July 1, 2022, trash and recycling services will be provided to Dedham residents by Boston Carting Services, LLC.

Trash will continue to be collected weekly, and recycling collection will occur every other week. **There is no change to your scheduled collection day**.

DEDHAM-WESTWOOD WATER DISTRICT VOLUNTARY WATER RESTRICTIONS IN PLACE

The following information was provided by the Dedham-Westwood Water District:

Effective May 1, 2022, the DWWD suggests that Dedham Residents limit use of outdoor lawn sprinklers to **Mondays and Thursdays** and Westwood Residents to Tuesdays and Fridays. The suggested hours to limit sprinkler use is **between 6:00AM-9:00 AM or 6:00PM-9:00 PM**.

The Dedham-Westwood Water District is committed to encouraging customers to conserve water. To help achieve that goal, the following items are available to our customers at no charge: Low flow shower-head and faucet aerators, Rain sensors for automatic lawn sprinkler systems, and Leak detection tablets (used to see if your toilet has a silent leak). Learn more about the <u>Water Conservation Rebate</u> <u>Program</u>.

Download the Dropcountr Mobile App

To help residents save water, Dedham-Westwood Water District is partnering with Charles River Watershed Association to provide an app for homeowners to track water usage and conserve. The free Dropcountr app will allow residents of Dedham and Westwood to track their monthly water use, compare it to similar households, connect with utility alerts and rebates and receive direct support.

Dedham and Westwood residents can set up a free Dropcountr account today by downloading the app from the <u>Apple</u> or <u>Android</u> App Store, or <u>signing up online</u>. You will need your name and account number as it appears on your Dedham-Westwood Water District bill.

The Dropcountr program is made available to Westwood and Dedham residents as part of a pilot project funded by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection under Water Management Act regulations. The project is a cooperative effort of the <u>Dedham-Westwood Water District</u>, Charles River Watershed Association and the <u>Neponset River Watershed Association</u>.

PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING UPDATES What to expect June 27, 2022 (Monday) through July 1, 2022 (Friday):

- The project site remains closed to the public.
- The base and foundation for the new cell tower is complete and installation of the new tower is slated for Wednesday, June 29th.
- Metal contractors will continue installing the parapet cap along the roof edge this week
- (see photo of work in progress below). Contractors specializing in acoustics will continue installing acoustic ceiling tiles on the first and second floors of the Fire Station.
- Installation of the elevator and associated machine room will continue this week.
- HVAC contractors will be onsite this week to continue installing hot water mains in the basement and insulate the basement ductwork. Installation of radiant heat tubing in the Apparatus Bay is complete.
- Testing of the fire protection system, including sprinklers, will take place this week. Electricians will be onsite to continue pulling data wire on the second floor of the Fire Station, install the lights on the second floor of the Fire Station, and will insulate the water piping on the first floor of the building.
- Painters will be onsite this week to prime and paint walls on the first and second floors of the building.
- Expect periodic entrance and exit of large trucks at the project site entrance, located at the intersection of Washington Street and Bryant Street. Please expect minor traffic delays at this intersection.
- No additional traffic impacts or pedestrian impacts are anticipated during this week.
