



Weekly Project Updates and 7-Day Look-Ahead

Here is a look-ahead at the construction work planned for the Public Safety Building, from August 8, 2022 to August 12, 2022

Project Overview:

Construction of a combined public safety building commenced in December 2020 on the site of the former Town Hall at 26 Bryant Street. The new building will house the staff and equipment of Fire, Police, and Dispatch departments. The new combined Public Safety Building will replace two older Town buildings: Police Station at 600 High Street (built in 1962) and the Fire Station at 436 Washington Street (built in 1930). The new building is scheduled to open in the Fall of 2022.

What to expect August 8, 2022 (Monday) through August 12, 2022 (Friday):

- The project site remains closed to the public.
- Contractors will be working onsite **Saturday**, **August 6**, **2022**, **between 8:00 AM and 4:00 PM.** There are no anticipated impacts to vehicular or pedestrian travel as a result of this work.
- Excavation and associated work will continue along Bryant Street and Washington Street this week. Crews are excavating for a 3-inch conduit to connect the new traffic signals, to be installed at a later date. **Please expect minor traffic delays in the area. Police will be onsite to help assist with traffic flow.** Work is expected to take place between 7:00 AM and 3:30 PM.
- Construction of the elevator cab will continue this week and is expected to be completed by August 9.
- The HVAC Contractors will continue installing valves and pipes for induction units on the second floor of the Police Station, insulating the piping to the induction unit on the second floor of the Fire Station, and will be installing a snow melt system along the apron at the north side of the building.
- Contractors will be installing sheet metal ductwork for the induction units in the basement.
- Plumber will be installing overhead piping the garage this week and will be insulating the Mechanical Room.
- Electricians will continue pulling data wires on the second floor of the Police and Fire Stations, install lights on the first floor of the Police Station, and will continue to work on electrical distribution system.
- Painters will continue painting within the basement and the ceiling of the Apparatus Bay.
- Acoustic ceiling tile grid will be installed in the basement this week.
- Installation of millwork will continue this week on the second floor of the Police and Fire Stations.
- Crews will continue installing epoxy flooring with the men's locker room on the second floor of the Fire Station.
- Expect periodic entrance and exit of large trucks at the project site entrance, located at the intersection of Washington Street and Bryant Street. **Please expect minor traffic delays at this intersection.**
- No additional traffic impacts or pedestrian impacts are anticipated during this week.

Public Viewing Area:


